How Big Is Your God?

There's a wonderful old song we used to sing years ago that talked about how big God is. But the important question for us to ask ourselves today is, "How big is my God?"

I'll tell you how big my God is—He's big enough to take care of all of my problems and meet all of my needs (Phil. 4:19)! My God is bigger than the devil, and He's bigger than my fears.

If we look at God's Word, we will see that God is so big, it's mind-boggling. Not only did God create the entire universe, but He also created you and me. And Psalm 139:14 says that we are fearfully and wonderfully made!

We can sing all the songs about the bigness of God, but the truth is, in some areas God seems so big to us, and in other areas He seems so small. It shouldn't be that way, but it is. In reality, God is bigger than any sickness and any need. We can triumph over any problem because of the bigness of our God.

Even though our God is a big, miraculous God, He still knows when a sparrow falls from the sky (Matt. 10:29). He knows when a tear falls from our eves. He knows the number of hairs on our heads.

God left the palaces of Heaven to have a relationship with you and me. And, even now, He has an open-door policy for all of His children. You don't have to go through a receptionist and two secretaries to get to your Heavenly Father. You can go straight to the Lord anytime you desire!

How big is your God? That depends on what you can believe for! If you can find a verse of Scripture to stand on, your God is big enough to bring it to pass. Romans 8:38–39 says that He's so big that nothing can separate you from Him. No person or problem is big enough or bad enough to cut you off from your God!

In reality, your God is as big as you will let Him be. So don't allow the challenges of life to be bigger than your God. He can squash those problems with His little finger—that's how big and awesome your God is!





What to Do When Comes Your Way



I believe you must deal with ful team! trouble both naturally and spiritually whenever it raises its ugly head. Let's first look at some natural ways of dealing with trouble.

Natural Ways Out

Number One: Get Rid of All of Your Excuses

It's easy to put the blame on others. You've probably heard

Number Two:

Don't Look Back: Your Answer Is Not Behind You

You cannot change the past; it's history. If the answers to your problems were behind you, you wouldn't be where you are now. You can't change your yesterdays. But you can change your future. Your tomorrows can be changed because your answer is in front of you.

Number Three:

Quit Comparing Yourself to Others

Comparing yourself to others will eat you up like a cancer. When God gave you dreams and plans for the future, He knew exactly who you were. He knew your shortcomings, and He knew where you could excel. Quit comparing yourself to others. It only hinders you from turning your dreams into realities.

Number Four:

Don't Second-Guess Yourself; Make a Decision and Live With It

Many years ago, I received some good advice: "When making a decision, look at all of the issues and then make a decision you can live with." People often make decisions based on emotions. Then, they later realize their decisions are impossible to live with. Take the necessary time to analyze a situation. Once you make a decision, stick with it.

Number Five:

Learn to Say 'I Don't Know'

You can't know everything, and you can't be everything to everyone. It's okay to say, "I don't know." Don't allow yourself to become intimidated if you don't know the answer to someone's question. If you don't know something, just say so. Then tell the person you will find out and get back with him or her.

Number Six:

Know Your Own Limits

Have a realistic evaluation of your abilities. Too many people believe they can accomplish tasks beyond their natural capabilities. You can't expect more out of yourself than you have the ability to achieve.

Number Seven: Give Clear Communication

No matter who you are talking to, clear communication is essential. We get into a lot of trouble—in relationships and on the job—just from a lack



The library and the Internet, of clear communication. People aren't mind readers, and a lot of misunderstandings can be avoided by making sure the other person understands what you are saying.

Spiritual Ways Out

Number One:

Remember That God Is With You and Wants to Help You

In Psalm 91:15, the Lord says, "He shall call upon me, and I will answer him: I will be with him in trouble; I will deliver him, and honour him." This verse does not say that God will only be with you *in the good times*. No. He will be with you in trouble—and He will deliver you out of trouble!

Number Two: Resist Fear

Fear is never liberating. It is only incapacitating. And fear hinders the supernatural from working for you. No matter how dire or impossible your situation may seem, you never have to fear when God is on your side. Find scriptures that deal with fear and those that promise freedom from fear and peace. Meditate on those scriptures, reading them and confessing them out loud whenever fear tries to come upon you.

Number Three: Realize That God Always Has a Way Out

First Corinthians 10:13 says, "There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God *is faithful, who will not suffer you to be* tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape..."

The Apostle Paul is letting you know that God will not allow you to go through tests and trials beyond what you can bear. And when you experience tribulation, God will *always* provide a way out. Instead of focusing on the problem, train your eyes to look for the way out!

Number Four:

Always Maintain a Good Attitude

James admonishes Christians to "... count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations" (James 1:2). By doing this, you maintain a proper spiritual attitude. Too many people have what I call "stinking attitudes." That is because they only complain and cry about the adversity they are facing instead of doing something about it.

Saving things like, "I don't understand why I'm going through this," won't

Stop Saying 'Can't Do'

When I was in grade school, my first grade teacher, Miss Finley, always used to tell our class, "Don't The words can't do do not exist in this class. If you really want to do something, you will always find a way to do it."

How true her words are. I'm sure you can look at your life and remember a time when you really wanted to do something. And even though your dream seemed impossible at the time, because you wanted it so badly, you found a way to accomplish it.

You are able to achieve success when you *believe* you are able to achieve it. Henry Ford once said, "Whether you think that you can, or that you can't, you are usually right."

A scripture that needs to be indelibly stamped in your spirit is

Philippians 4:13, which says, "I can do everything through Him who gives me strength" (NIV). Each time ever say you can't do something. you find yourself in a challenging situation and people around you are saying you can't do something, respond back to them with this verse.

> If you hold firm to your faith and stand your ground against the devil, God will make the crooked way straight. He will make the valley come up, and He will bring the mountains down low so that you can walk on level ground (Isa. 40:4; Luke 3:5). The Lord will break down the gates of bronze and cut through the bars of iron that stand between you and what He's called you to do (Isa. 45:2). But you must first believe that you can do anything you set your heart to do through Him Who gives you strength.

change your situation. But when you "count it all joy" in spite of what you are experiencing, you are maintaining the necessary attitude of faith. And faith is what will change your situation.

Number Five: Walk in Love

The only commandment Jesus gave to believers was the commandment of love (John 13:34). And the way to fulfill this commandment is outlined in First Corinthians chapter 13. If you will be a faithful doer of the verses in First Corinthians 13, you will automatically eliminate a lot of adversity in your life.

Number Six:

Use Your Faith

Use your faith to move mountainsized trouble from your life (Mark 11:23). To move any kind of mountain, you must believe in your heart that the Word of God is able to change what looks unchangeable. This is done by believing the Word instead of what you see or feel. Scripture has to be the highest and final authority in your life.

Number Seven:

Maintain the Proper Confession

Some people constantly talk about their troubles. But doing this does not help your faith. In fact, a negative tongue will get you in trouble. We're told to "... hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised)" (Heb. 10:23). When we remember that the One Who promised is faithful to bring those promises to pass, we are better able to watch our tongue and speak more about the promises than we do about the problems.

As you follow the steps I have outlined, realize that people in your life might try to put pressure on you. They might try to pull you away from the Word of God. But you must be strong and stand your ground.

Psalm 34:17 says, "The righteous cry, and the Lord heareth, and delivereth them out of all their troubles." This is God's promise to you. He is faithful to perform His Word, and He is faithful to perform His Word in *your* life.



"Fight the good fight of faith...." —1 Timothy 6:12

he fight of faith is the only battle Christians are called upon to fight. There wouldn't be such a fight to faith if there weren't enemies or hindrances to faith. But when we understand the enemies to faith and avoid them, our faith will grow.

One main hindrance to our faith is the lack of understanding of our righteousness, or our right standing with God.

JAMES 5:16

16 Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual

fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

This passage states that the prayer of "a righteous man" avails much. A lack of understanding of what righteousness is holds more Christians in bondage than any other thing. In my opinion, righteousness is one of the most misunderstood subjects in the Bible.

ROMANS 10:10

10 For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness....

ROMANS 5:17

17 For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of

grace and the gift of righteouness shall reign in life by one. Jesus Christ.

Notice that Paul makes two significant statements about righteousness:

1. With the *heart* man believes unto righteousness.

2. When we receive Jesus and we are born again, we receive "the gift of righteousness."

Righteousness is a gift. Too often we have associated righteousness with good works. The Bible teaches good works and right conduct, but all of our good works and right conduct will never make us righteous. If good works made us righteous, we wouldn't need Jesus.

You will never be any more righteous than you are right now!

Another fallacy about righteousness is that we've thought we had to grow into some kind of "high spiritual state" to be righteous. Well, thank God, we can grow in the Lord and we can develop spiritually. But we cannot grow in righteousness. You will never be any more righteous than you are right now!

In the Old Testament, God set up a system whereby the blood of animals was shed to cover the sins of His people. God did not hold sin against them; instead He "counted" them as being righteous.

PSALM 32:1-2

1 Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. 2 Blessed is the man unto whom the Lord imputeth not iniquity....

In the New Testament, the Bible says we have a better Covenant established on better promises (Heb. 8:6). In Christian circles, we've heard it said, "Our sins are covered." But our sins aren't covered. Our sins are *washed away* by the blood of Jesus!

2 CORINTHIANS 5:17, 21

17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. 21 For he hath made him [God has made Jesus] to be sin for us, who knew no sin: that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him.

Did you notice the phrases "in Christ" and "in Him" in these verses? In Christ we become new creatures (v. 17). In Him we become the righteousness of God when we are born again (v. 21).

When you receive Jesus as your Savior, you become a new man-a new creature in Christ. God does not make any "unrighteous" new creatures.

Romans 10:10 says, "For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness...." How does a man become righteous? He believes unto righteousnessbecause he believes on Him who is our righteousness, Jesus Christ!

When you know this truth, you'll know that God hears your prayers just as quickly as He hears anyone else's. Your standing with God is just as good as any other Christian's.

A minister doesn't have any better standing with God than you do. A minister has a *duty* or a *responsibility* that you don't have. But that responsibility doesn't make him any more *righteous* or give him any better standing with God. God won't answer his prayers any more quickly than He'll hear and answer your prayers.

God doesn't love one member of the Body of Christ more than another. We've got all kinds of wrong ideas about this, such as, "If I could just get a *real* man of God to pray for me, God would answer." Some Christians may have learned how to take advantage of what belongs to them better than you have, but they are not any more *righteous* than you are. God won't hear them pray any more quickly than He'll hear you pray.

I'm thoroughly convinced that in these last days bands of believers will learn how to take their place in Christ, knowing who and what they are in Him. Talk about prayer warriors! Talk about consecrated, dedicated lives of prayer! Talk about getting results! And they won't have to be dependent on someone else to pray to get answers for them.

FAITH IN ACTION

Reigning in Life With Christ

Romans 5:17 says, "For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness SHALL REIGN IN LIFE by one, Jesus Christ."

This verse lets us know that we are to reign in life now-not just when we get to Heaven. The Amplified Bible says that we shall "... reign as kings in life through the one Man Jesus Christ (the Messiah, the Anointed One)." We don't have many kings today, and the kings who do remain don't have much authority or ruling power. However, in the day in which Paul wrote this verse, a king's word was the final authority in his domain.

We need to grasp this truth: The Word of God says we are to reign as kings in this life through the authority of Jesus Christ. And it's in this life that we run up against Satan on every side. But because of our righteousness, we can stand in the presence of Satan without fear. And because of our righteousness, Satan can no longer condemn us.

When you know the truth of righteousness, you can stand in the presence of Satan with the authority of Jesus Christ. That authority gives you dominion over Satan and over every evil work he may try to bring against you.

gift of righteousness. I can see that we've been made righteous new creatures, but what about those sins and wrongdoings I've committed since I've become a Christian?"

Satan used this very thing to defeat me after I learned these facts about righteousness. He said, "Since you've been saved, you've sinned. Remember when you got angry and lost your temper?" (He knew he could no longer dispute my righteousness, because the Word is true and I'd discovered the truth.)

I felt so guilty that I'd missed it. But I began to look at the Word again, and I found this verse in First John:

1 JOHN 1:9

9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

John wasn't writing to sinners here. He was writing to Christians, because He called them "my little children."

1 JOHN 2:1-2

1 My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous....


When a man sins, he is under condemnation and he loses his sense of righteousness. But when he confesses. "I've sinned and I failed. Please forgive me, in Jesus' Name," God does two things. According to First John 1:9, God *forgives AND cleanses* us from our sins. If God just forgave us our sin, it wouldn't help us much. We would still be under the condemnation of sin. But God actually CLEANSES us from all sin.

What does God cleanse us from? All unrighteousness! Not part of our unrighteousness, but all of it.

After I saw this in the Word, I came back to the devil with that news and put him on the run. Up until then the devil had *me* on the run. Now *he*'s the one who turns and runs. He found out that I know what the Word of God says about my righteousness in God through Christ!



Jesus said in Mark 16:15, "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation" (NIV). The students, alumni, and staff of RHEMA Bible Training Center are taking Jesus' mandate in this verse seriously.

Because Christianity is all about reaching the world, RHEMA students are given many opportunities to take the lessons they're learning to people beyond the classroom. Every year, a variety of missions trips are offered to the RBTC

student body. People are saved. Lives are changed. The sick are healed. And RHEMA students are a part of it all.

This month, student missions trips are planned to Peru, Zambia, and a Navajo reservation in Arizona. Missions trips are scheduled during the week of spring break to allow students to travel without missing classes. Each trip is different. Some are focused on preaching the Gospel in crusades. Others are devoted to ministering to youth and children. Still

others revolve around helping build facilities at RHEMA Bible Training Centers around the world.

As the early Church disciples went out and preached, ... the Lord worked with them and confirmed his word by the signs that accompanied it" (Mark 16:20 NIV). The same can be said of those who participate in RBTC missions trips. As they go, the Lord works with them and confirms His Word with signs following.

In March 2008, a RHEMA team traveled to Mexico City to work with Tim and Rhonda Rogers, the directors of RBTC

Mexico and pastors of RHEMA Bible Church Mexico. During the week, the 28-member team traveled to small villages and towns near Mexico City, ministered to more than 1,600 people, and saw more than 100 people accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior. The students held open-air crusades, ministered on the streets, taught in local churches, led worship, ministered to a youth group, and conducted water baptisms.

The team saw many healings as they ministered. One

elderly man attended an evening service in the town of Tulcingo. He had problems with his eyes, but after members of the RHEMA team prayed for him, he was able to see clearly.

The missions team also shared the love of God through practical ministry—washing and cutting hair, and helping with a dental station. "The trip was unique in that the ministry met both the practical and spiritual needs of the people in Mexico," said team leader Joe Duininck, head of the RHEMA School of World Missions. "Sharing the love of God by washing and cutting hair was something new

for a RHEMA trip. Also, the dental clinic demonstrated love and provided care to a real area of need in the people's lives.

"The team members really took advantage of the opportunity to be a blessing," Duininck said. "They were eager to help and ready to do whatever it took to make the trip fruitful. From learning Spanish worship music to sharing testimonies, they were a great representation of what RHEMA is all about. Faith and love weren't just some things learned to pass a test. They were put into practice ministering as the Body of Christ."



Don't Worry-Put on the Garment Draise LYNETTE HAGIN

> You don't have to look very far to know that we are living in difficult times. Nowadays, the nightly news makes it easy to be tempted to worry and forget about the promises of God. But in times like these, it is important for you keep your mind stayed on the Lord.

I want to tell you about a man named Ralph. Poor Ralph was head over heels in trouble. But he was not doing much to help himself. So a friend took Ralph aside to talk to him.

"Ralph, you have two hands," the friend said. "Why don't you do something with them?"

"Well, I am," Ralph promptly replied. "I'm wringing both of them!"

Maybe you feel like Ralph. You might be in a situation where you are making faith confessions such as, "My God shall supply all my needs in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:19). Or, "I can do all things through Christ Who strengthens me" (Phil. 4:13). But although you are standing on the Word, you are also wringing your hands!

Many Christians would never admit to worrying. Instead, they would probably say they are "concerned." But whether you call it worry or concern, it's really the same thing.

We are all confronted with situations that try to get the best of us. Unfortunately, stress and worry have become a way of life for many-even for Christians.



The enemy would like us to get so caught up in the cares of life that we stop concentrating on the Father's business.

If you allow worry to consume your thoughts instead of keeping your mind stayed on the Lord, you can open yourself up to many health-related problems. High blood pressure, ulcers, and depression are only a few illnesses that can be caused by stress.

Someone once said that worry is the interest you pay on troubles that seldom come. It's also been said, "Worry is like a rocking chair—it gives you something to do but it doesn't get you anywhere."

> I don't want to clutter my mind with things that I can't do anything about.

I don't know about you, but I don't want to waste my time doing something that avails nothing. I want to go somewhere, not sit still worrying! And I don't want to clutter my mind with things that I can't do anything about. I once heard someone say, "Worry is wasting today's time to clutter up tomorrow's opportunities with vesterday's troubles."

In life's journey, worry is one of the most difficult pieces of baggage to shed. It can be a tough habit to break. Usually, when you allow yourself to worry, the devil will bring all kinds of imaginations to you. At times, it can even be hard to quiet your mind.


You may have to force your mind to focus on the things of the Lord. But you are promised peace when you keep your mind on Jesus. Isaiah 26:3 says, "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee."


The Apostle Paul made this scripture a part of his life. It's evident that he had many opportunities to worry. But instead, he chose to keep his mind stayed on the Lord—to put on the garment of praise and magnify God no matter what he experienced.

Take a look at what Paul wrote when he was chained and in prison.

PHILIPPIANS 4:4-7 (NIV) 4 Rejoice in the Lord always. I will sav it again: Rejoice! 5 Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. 6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

When he wrote this, Paul was facing execution and had every reason to be anxious. Yet, he refused to worry. His strategy for dealing with stress and anxiety was to rejoice in the Lord.

One time my husband was given a replica of a fish that was mounted on a placard. The fish was activated by motion. And every time you walked by it, the fish would sing the famous song, "Don't Worry, Be Happy."

"Don't Worry, Be Happy" is a motto we believers need to live by. Instead of allowing a spirit of heaviness to grip our hearts, we must learn to rejoice in the Lord. And the Lord will provide for us a garment of praise instead of the spirit of heaviness (Isa. 61:3). When we rejoice in the Lord, we will have strength, peace, and happiness-no matter what the situation looks like. We don't have to worry about anything. We only need to keep our eyes fixed on the Lord.

Putting on the garment of praise and rejoicing in the Lord may not feel like the *easiest* thing to do, but it is definitely the *best* thing you can do in hard times.

PSALM 13:4-6 (NIV)

4 My enemy will say, "I have overcome him," and my foes will rejoice when I fall.

5 But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. 6 I will sing to the Lord. for he has been good to me.

PSALM 5:11-12 (NIV)

11 But let all who take refuge in you be glad; let them ever sing for joy. Spread your protection over them, that those who love your name may rejoice in you.

12 For surely, O Lord, you bless the righteous; you surround them with your favor as with a shield.

Instead of worrying, follow King David's advice and begin to sing. Why? Because God has been good to you. He is the One Who can take care of any situation in your life, and praising Him gives Him access to work in your life.

You see, thanksgiving and praise are kingdom keys that open the doors to the courts of Almighty God (Ps. 100:4). It's easy to get caught up in your daily routine and neglect spend-King David is another example of ing time with the Lord. But when that happens, the cares of life *will* begin to overtake vou.

Whenever you encounter a tough spot in life, steal away and spend time with the Lord. Jesus said, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matt. 11:28). It's in the Presence of the Lord that you can cast off a spirit of heaviness and replace it with the garment of praise. God's Presence is where you find fullness of joy (Ps. 16:11).

Your life doesn't have to be consumed with worry. You can confidently face the future and overcome any hardship. When worry tries to wrap itself around you, throw it off like a tattered garment. Put on the garment of praise and watch the Lord miraculously turn your situation around.

In my home, I purposely create an atmosphere that enables me to enter into God's Presence. I do this by constantly playing praise and worship CDs. I even have music playing when I'm not home.

I always surround myself with music. If I'm in a car, praise music is playing. If I'm traveling, I bring a CD player with me and play worship music in the hotel room. You see, when you are in church, the first order of the service is praise and worship. This is done to help people shut their minds off and open their spirits to God's Presence.

According to Scripture, praise is a doorway into God's Presence. We are to enter God's courts-His Presencewith thanksgiving and praise. And when we are in the Presence of God, we can fellowship with Him, learn of Him, and seek His will in whatever situations we might be facing.

me with congestive heart failure which is 'incurable.' They took a picture of covered the bottom of both of my lungs.

"The Lord will guide you always: he will satisfy your needs in a sun-scorched land and will strengthen your frame. You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail." — Isaiah 58:11 (NIV)



I love springtime. It reminds me of my father. Although we never lived on a farm, he always enjoyed planting a garden in our backyard. He would plant the vegetables and fruits that our family enjoyed the most. Tomatoes were one of his favorites. However, he also planted other fruits and vegetables. I remember the year that we had the sweetest onions I had ever

tasted. Although he planted onions in future years, none quite compared with those of that year. Often, he would also plant cantaloupe and watermelon. He would save the seed from the best of those and plant them the next year.

As I was reminiscing about planting a natural garden, I began to ponder a greater question-What kind of seeds are we planting in the garden of our lives? One of the scripture passages that my parents consistently brought to my attention was Galatians 6:7-8 (NKJV): "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked: for whatever a man sows. that he will also reap. For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life."

I like The Message translation of this scripture, which says. "Don't be misled: No one makes a fool of God. What a person plants, he will harvest. The person who plants selfishness, ignoring the needs of others-ignoring God!harvests a crop of weeds. All he'll have to show for his life is weeds! But the one who plants in response to God, letting God's Spirit do the growth work in him. harvests a crop of real life. eternal life."

My parents quoted these verses to me many times. When I wanted to act carnally, this passage reminded me to act God's way. This scripture planted a godly fear in my heart-a desire to plant good seeds in my life. I have always been a long-term planner, even as a child. Therefore, I realized early that if I wanted good things coming my way as an adult, I had better start planting good seeds right then.

What attributes should we plant in our garden? Allow me around you. to name a few that I have tried to plant in the garden of

my life. One of the greatest seeds that we need to plant is not judging others. Jesus clearly revealed this principle in Matthew 7:1-3 (NKJV): "Judge not, that you be not judged. For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged; and with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you. And why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye. but do not consider the plank in your own eve?"

One principle I have always lived by is, "Unless you have walked in exactly the same shoes as another person, don't judge the decisions that person has made." Occasionally someone says to me concerning someone else's children, "If those were my children, I would do such-and-such." I always reply, "You don't know what you would do unless you encountered that same situation." So I encourage you not to judge others.

Another seed that I have planted is to restore others. The first verse of Galatians chapter 6 (NKJV) says, "Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted.'

Once again. I like how The Message translates this verse: "Live creatively, friends. If someone falls into sin, forgivingly restore him, saving your critical comments for yourself. You might be needing forgiveness before the day's out . . ." We need to plant seeds of mercy and restoration toward others to reap the same ourselves.

Another seed we need to plant is forgiveness. For me, this was a hard one. When someone treated me unkindly, I would say the words "I forgive," but I would not forget the wrong that had been done. When I received the revelation that true forgiveness also forgets the wrong. I had to make a heart adjustment. It meant digging up those seeds of hurt and bitterness and replacing them with love and forgiveness.

These are just a few of the seeds that we must plant in the garden of our lives. As we approach springtime, many of us are doing spring cleaning. We are getting rid of the clutter in our homes. I challenge you to do the same in your life. Take an inventory of the seeds that you have been planting. Replace destructive seeds with constructive seeds, and you'll see a difference in your life and in the lives of those
